University of Saint Francis - Fort Wayne Graduation Rate Report for 2018 Cohort

In accordance with the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, the University of Saint Francis is pleased to share with you the following information on the graduation rates of our 2018 cohort of full-time, first-time, degree-seeking undergraduate students and student athletes that received athletic financial aid. The rates represent the percentage of such students who finish within a time equivalent to 150% of the standard length of their program (e.g., 6 years for a 4-year program). The graduation rates of these groups by gender and race/ethnicity are presented in the following table. Students who leave the University of Saint Francis prior to completing their program, including those who transfer to another university, are considered as non-finishers. Note that the following rates exclude from both the numerator and the denominator any students who were transfers-in to the University of Saint Francis.
